One back and one lineman will receive a Scholar-Athlete Scholarship of \$2000. Each of the remaining six finalists will receive a Scholar-Athlete Scholarship of \$500. Contributions made to the King County Chapter are tax deductible as a 501C non-profit organization.

The annual chapter shotgun golf tournament will be held on August 9th at the Fort Lewis Golf Course. *The chapter appreciates the sponsorship by the Pacific Northwest 7-Eleven Franchise Owners Assn. for hosting this tournament.* All proceeds go directly to our scholarship fund.

The King County Chapter is proud to report the success of two ongoing programs; *Play It Smart* and *the Coaching Academy*. The *Play It Smart* program, places an "academic coach" in the selected High School to help monitor and plan a students academic goals and progress. The *Play it Smart* program is currently in place at Rainier Beach & Chief Sealth High Schools. Where it is receiving high levels of praise. The *Coaching Academy* was held last July at the new Seattle Seahawk's headquarters for youth and high school coaches. 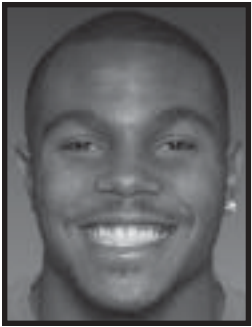

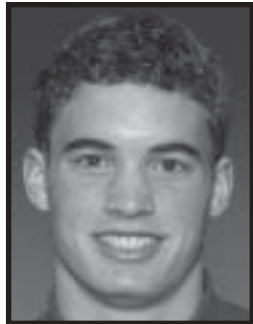

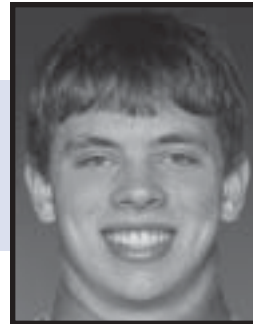

### 2004 Award Winner - Jerry Parrish

This year's much deserving Tony Gasparovich Memorial Award winner, Jerry Parrish, has spent the past 46 years teaching and coaching in Washington. Jerry began teaching in 1959 at Snohomish, he went on to become a head football coach in 1967 in Colfax and three years later moved back to his home town of Marysville opening the new Pilchuck High School.

In 1973, the Parrish family moved to Poulsbo and a position at North Kitsap High School, where Jerry has been the head football coach for the past 31 years. The Vikings have had 27 winning seasons. His head coaching record is 209 wins, 139 losses and 4 ties.

Jerry has been Secretary/Treasurer of the Washington State Coaches Association since 1992. He has been actively involved in planning All-Star Football games since 1978 and is currently promoting a fast growing football clinic for high school and middle level coaches in Washington. He was named to the Washington State Football Coaches Hall of Fame in 1993 and he was Seahawks Coach of the Week in 1999. Jerry, his wife of 46 years Gladys, all three of their children and two granddaughters continue to live in Washington.
