


Seattle Chapter (founded in 1965)

The Seattle Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame is one of more than 113 chapters throughout the country that honor student-athletes. The foundation promotes amateur football at all levels recognizing teams, coaches, officials, administrators, and young men who excel both as a player and as a student.

This chapter represents 64 high school football programs throughout King and Kitsap Counties. At the end of the season, each coach nominates two of his players, a back and lineman, for recognition by the NFF. Each year the selection committee made up of former coaches, players, and administrators has a difficult task in narrowing down the list to the final eight, four backs and four linemen.

One back and one lineman will receive a Scholar-Athlete Scholarship of \$2,000. Each of the remaining six finalists will receive a Scholar-Athlete Scholarship of \$500. Contributions made to the Seattle Chapter are tax deductible as a 501C non-profit organization.

The annual chapter shotgun golf tournament will be held on **August 9th** at the Washington National Course in Auburn. *The chapter appreciates the sponsorship by the Pacific Northwest 7-Eleven Franchise Owners Assn. in hosting this tournament.* All proceeds go directly to our scholarship fund.

The Seattle Chapter is proud to report the success of two ongoing programs; *Play It Smart* and *the Coaching Academy*. The *Play It Smart* program places an “academic coach” in the selected high school to help monitor and plan a student’s academic goals and progress. The *Play it Smart* program is currently in place at Rainier Beach & Chief Sealth High Schools where it is receiving high levels of praise. The *Coaching Academy* was held last July at the new Seattle Seahawk’s headquarters for youth and high school coaches. The two-day clinic elevates the quality of coaching at the youth, junior high, and high school levels. 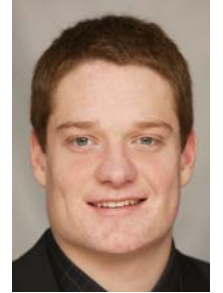
